### Exchange to Honor Vietnam Veterans with Lapel Pins on March 29


The Army & Air Force Exchange Service will once again honor the selfless service of Vietnam-era Veterans on National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

PXs and BXs worldwide will present our heroes with free commemorative lapel pins during ceremonies March 29. As

a Vietnam-era Veteran, this small token of appreciation is especially meaningful. In the 1970s, the American public did not fully understand Vietnam Veterans' sacrifices. These heroes did not receive the respect and homecoming they deserved. For many, the Exchange's pinning ceremonies represent a long-overdue hero's welcome.

Since 2013, the Exchange has partnered with the United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration to honor Vietnam-era Veterans for their service, valor and sacrifice. The annual pinning ceremonies are one way the Exchange honors its commitment to the Commemoration.

The pins are offered to Veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time from Nov. 1, 1955, to May 15, 1975. ## Select Overseas Gas Stations Begin Daily Pricing Adjustments

As energy markets experience unprecedented volatility, the Army & Air Force Exchange Service is implementing daily pricing adjustments at its gas stations in Germany. As a result, pump prices will largely reflect current costs to provide uninterrupted fuel services at overseas installations.

When fuel costs at overseas locations exceed the DoE average plus incremental dispensing costs, daily reviews of procured and incremental dispensing costs are used to set pump prices.

This approach will ensure pump prices are adjusted as market conditions improve while protecting dividends for critical military Quality-of-Life programs for service members and their families.
