## Improving Connectivity—and Quality of Life

The Exchange's Advanced Telecom Services team is making great strides in delivering Quality-of-Life improvements to Army and Air Force installations worldwide with markedly improved cell service.

In 2023, the Exchange helped bring 31 cell towers and 201 small cells, which have smaller antennae to complement cell tower coverage, to military communities to better connect service members to their families, friends and the information they need.

Highlights included a new 5G cell tower at Helemano Military Reservation (HMR) in Hawaii in January. HMR provides military housing for about 2,000 service members and families stationed at Schofield Barracks and Wheeler Army Airfield. The tower is one of 13 new cell tower projects that will dramatically expand connectivity throughout USAG Hawaii.



The Exchange also broke ground on a new 5G tower at Fort Bliss in February. Lack of reliable cell service had been a long-standing challenge on post, receiving regular attention in surveys and town halls. This was the first of 10 cell towers planned for construction across Fort Bliss in 2024.

Providing reliable cell service is an invaluable investment in support of recruiting, retention and readiness. The communities spoke, leaders listened and the Exchange is helping to deliver significantly improved QoL support to service members and their families.
